## A Dozen Ideas for Your Daily Daff

- 1) See how many words you can create from the word **Daffodil**
- 2) Create a daffodil painting. Check out examples by Claude Monet, Berthe Morisot, and Félix Vallotton.
- 3) Learn to identify parts of a daffodil at <https://daffodilusa.org>
- 4) Do some research! Find out what genus and family daffodils belong to. What is the Latin name for daffodils? What is this flower called in other countries around the world?
- 5) Take a walk around your neighborhood and count how many different types of daffs you can spot.
- 6) Write a daffodil haiku – **3 lines, using 5,7, and 5 syllables**

- 7) Pick a few daffodils to press and dry. (leave undisturbed for 2-4 weeks) You'll have daffs to keep until next year's blooms!
- 8) Take a "daffodil drive" through Amity and the Eola hills. Notice the prolific and bright plantings of daffs throughout our community.
- 9) Draw a daffodil from memory. Make a second drawing with a fresh picked example in front of you. How are your two drawings different?
- 10) Check out [dafftube.org](http://dafftube.org) for information on how to cut, classify, and groom daffodils for showing and judging.
- 11) Make plans to visit **Amity's Daffodil Festival March 26<sup>th</sup>** at the Amity Community Center. Bring along your best daffodil specimen to be displayed for all.
